

Orla



The history of the synagogue in Orla dates back to the seventeenth century. For decades it was a living center of Jewish tradition and culture.

In the spring of 1942, the Jewish community of Orla was forcibly moved into a ghetto and, later that year, transported to Treblinka extermination camp. The former synagogue was used as a storehouse for property stolen by German soldiers from the Jewish population and the Ark was destroyed.



After World War II, the building was occasionally used as a storage facility, but frequently stood empty and neglected, its condition deteriorating. In 2010, the synagogue came under the ownership of the Foundation for the Preservation of Jewish Heritage in Poland (FODZ).



Today, the former synagogue building towering over the village is a witness to common past of the inhabitants of this region. It also recalls the history of the Jewish community, which for decades was an important part of Orla community and its surroundings.



In previous decades the building was considered to be abandoned and stayed closed – it would seem – left to itself, it stayed empty like a rock in the tissue of the town. However, for several recent years, after FODZ took over property rights of the building, a group of enthusiasts has been acting to bring life to its walls. As a result of their activities, the building of former synagogue again became a "meeting place" for the local community as well as for visitors coming to Orla from various parts of Poland as well as from abroad.

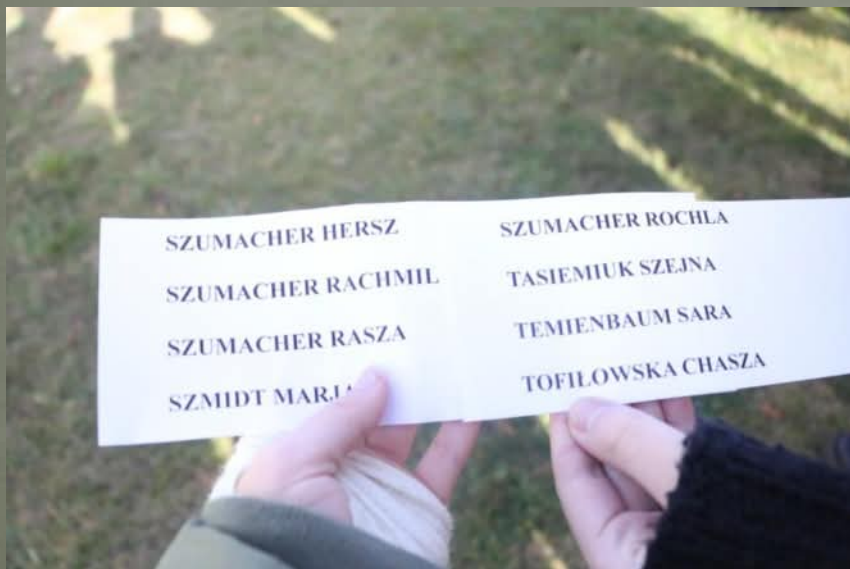


The following events and meetings were held inside the former

- exhibitions of contemporary art and photography









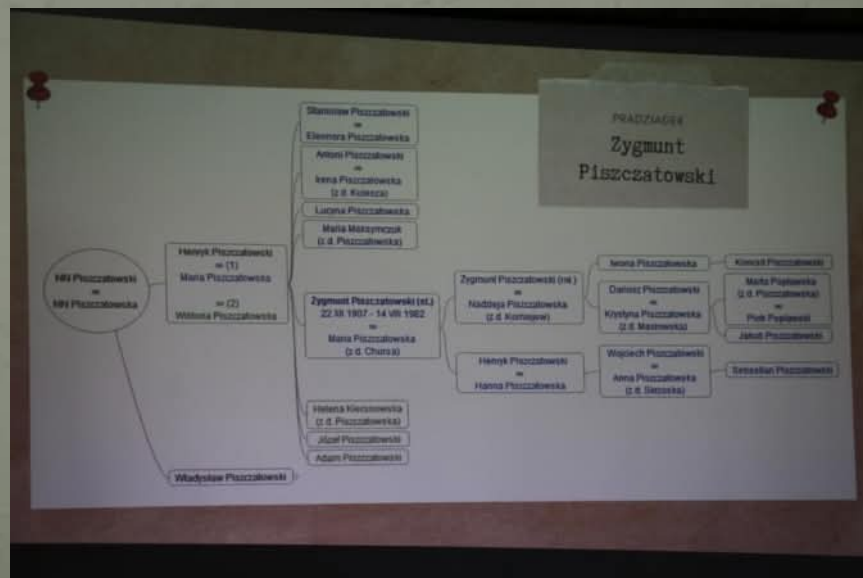


- meetings with authors

These activities was possible thanks to cleaning, care and organizational works carried out in the synagogue and its surroundings by a group of local volunteers.



We regret to explain that this year, as a result of administrative decisions, the above-mentioned activities in the former synagogue have been suspended. Their resumption will be possible only after the necessary preventive works have been carried out.

Technical expertise

In order to define the range of necessary preventive works technical expertise was done in early 2023. The aim of the expertise was to determine the technical condition of the former synagogue building in terms of renovation and revitalization of the facility and the possibility of its further use for cultural activities.

Recommendations

The technical expertise allowed to present the recommendations, the implementation of which will allow the resumption of former activities. Taking into account the technical condition of individual elements of the building, the building is eligible for renovation in the nearest possible period. Until the recommendations are implemented, the building should stay closed for visitors and any activities.

1. Wykonać doraźną reperację podstawy filarów Nr 1-4 (oznaczenie na rzucie parteru – Załącznik Nr 1 do niniejszej ekspertyzy) za pomocą cegły pełnej, czerwonej, o wytrzymałości na ściskanie min. 12 MPa i zaprawy cementowo-wapiennej marki min. 5MPa. Zachować oryginalne wymiary obrysu.

2. Naprawić wyrwę w połaci dachowej z pokryciem dachówką pokazaną na Fot.18
3. Odcinkami przemurować pionowe i skośne (Fot.6,7) rozwarstwienia muru

Repair and maintenance recommendations

The following building repair works must be carried out:

1. Repair of the base of the pillars with solid, red brick and cement-lime mortar;
2. Repair the gap in the roof;
3. Repair of vertical and diagonal wall stratifications of the structural wall. Works should be done from the inside and outside to the depth of one brick;

2. Naprawić wytnię w połaci dachowej z pokryciem dachówką pokazaną na Fot.18
3. Odcinając przesuwać pionowo i skośnie (Fot.6,7) rozwarstwienia muru poprzeczną ścianą konstrukcyjną w osi D-D za pomocą cegły pełnej, czerwonej o wytrzymałości na ściskanie min 12 MPa i zaprawy cementowo-wapiennej marki min 5MPa. Przesuwanie od strony wewnętrznej i zewnętrznej na głębokość min. 1 cegły (tj. 25 cm dla cegły pełnej)
4. Zamurować otwór na łącznika ścian (Fot.31) za pomocą cegły pełnej o wytrzymałości na ściskanie min 12 MPa i zaprawy cementowo-wapiennej marki min 5MPa.

5. Ustawić kolumnę przemiennego murowania typu wawrzawskiego do H=9,00m i dokonać delikatnego „opiekania” powierzchni sklepienia krzyżowego (Fot.32).

4. Brick up the opening at the wall joint;
5. Remove all falling off remnants of plaster and brick surface;
6. Fix a protective net over the entire surface of the Main Hall.

After completing the works described above, the building of the former synagogue in Orla can be used and allowed to visit.
